

As we begin this year's campaign, I would like to congratulate all the Councils last year that achieved bonus status as over \$103,000 was distributed back to local councils.



We commend to those Councils who made the Comeback Club. Books have been given to the Minor coordinators who will be distributing them shortly. Councils should be planning their activities for Spring functions. The Quick Start drawing will held on Sunday July 20 at the Villa Roma. This drawing is only for back covers.

A few changes for this yea:

- Charities supported with C&B funds are listed on the back page
- The winner's Council of Quick Start and Early Bird Drawing top prize will receive \$200 for the Quick Start and \$400 for the Early Bird to be donated to the Charity of the winner's Council choice if they make Quota. This replaces the Book Credits award.
- There will be an award at the 2026 Convention to the top DD in each Conference who has the largest growth of books per member for their District.

Last year we grew books per member to .88 in the State. One book per member is reachable if everyone gives it a little extra push.



We are now in the Fourth Quarter of the Columbian year and our Membership growth since Election Day has been solid and as I compose this article I am pleased to announce that we have recruited 1930 new Brothers to our ranks. Our raw recruitment number places New York State in 8th position order wide. Moreover, our overall effort that places us in fourth in the United States.

Supreme's growth metric is measured in percentages and our number places us in 44th place with a percentage to goal of 73.74%.

We are within striking distance of reaching 100% and if we can close April and open the Convention on May 1 with a percentage to goal of 75% or better, suggests that the NY State Council can easily reach our COH Goal based upon our past performance.

To spur growth in the Fourth quarter, the State Deputy has instructed the Membership Team to announce the latest set of incentives that will help us to finish the year Strong!

We are calling this incentive 7 Weeks to Success! Commencing on May 5^{th,} it will specifically give Council's that have achieved 50% or less of their assigned quota the opportunity to get back out there and bring in their assigned number plus 2 more members. Those Councils who achieve this will receive a 5% rebate on their 4th quarter Per Capita!

The Second Incentive is the Paul Diorio Extra Effort Award and will be open to all Councils that achieve the highest recruitment percentage to goal. The Grand Knight of that Council that receives the highest percentage will receive an overnight trip to the Knights of Columbus Musuem and if possible, a tour of Supreme.




As I sit to write this month's message, so many thoughts are going through my head. Our NYS Convention is on the horizon, where we gather with our Brothers from all over this great State of New York. It is always such an amazing time. A time when we get to see old friends and meet new

friends. This year we will elect new Officers, the Officers who will guide us through the next two years. And as whenever we go through a transition, it has a tinge of sadness to it, but we also have a sense of excitement as we anticipate the arrival of a new administration. Before I go any further I must say that is was a terrific honor to serve with the group of Brother Knights in the current administration. All of the Officers, Priests, Directors, Administrators and Chairmen are absolutely a remarkable group of individuals who worked so hard to carry on the work of this great State and the Order. And I do not want to leave out their wives and families who are always there too! I truly feel Blessed to have been able to be a small part of it.

I am also reflecting on the very recent passing of our Holy Father, Pope Francis. It is amazing to me that the words and teachings of our Holy Father could be considered controversial to fellow Catholics, but they were. Many accused him of being a third-worldist and a communist, or even worse, a liberal. I suppose it is because he said no to an economy of exclusion and inequality, no to an economy that kills, no to an economy without a human face, no to an unjust social and economic system that locks us into unjust social structures, no to a globalization of indifference, no to the idolatry of money, no to money that governs rather than serves, no to an inequality that engenders violence, no to anyone who tries to hide behind God to justify violence, no to the social insensitivity that anesthetizes us in the face of the suffering of others, no to human trafficking, no to any form of provoked death. Pope Francis did nothing but update the commandment "Thou shall not kill," defend the value of human life from beginning to end and repeated in the present day the Lord's question to Cain: "Where is your brother?". I always thought that fell into line with what we as Knights do. He preached empathy, mercy, forgiveness and welcomed sinners into the Church. Sound familiar? It should. I will miss him.

Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires, Argentina to Italian immigrant parents, was the first pope from the Americas and the first born outside of Europe in over a millennia. He will likely be remembered as the most progressive pontiff in the Catholic Church's history. His leadership - of over some 1.4 billion Catholics globally - will be remembered for outreach to women, immigrants and refugees, LGBTQ+


people, and people from other faiths. He sometimes took progressive or controversial stances on pressing issues, such as same-sex couples and climate change.

Over the years, the pope from South America left his mark in unprecedented ways. Pope Francis spoke openly about many issues afflicting the Church and indeed the world, visited countries no pope before him ever visited, met with controversial figures, and made the cover of magazines such as Time and Rolling Stone.

Throughout his papacy, Francis was celebrated for his commitment to humility, social justice, and outreach to marginalized communities. Born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires, the pontiff was also the first Jesuit pope in the history of elected popes. Throughout his tenure, he transformed old thinking, merging them with the modern times while aligning with the Catholic Church's ancient teachings, championing compassion over dogma. "Let us pray for one another. Let us pray for the whole world," he urged. His papacy championed a Church that operates like a "field hospital", where healing and aid takes precedence over judgement. He called for a faith rooted in empathy, encouraging inclusion for those historically marginalized by the Church, encouraging meaningful dialogue in an effort to bridge gaps between the traditional teachings and the contemporary realities. When first elected pope, he was asked the question "who is Jorge Mario Bergoglio? His answer was simply "a sinner". As we reflect on Pope Francis' legacy, we recognize a leader who brought moral clarity to a world often clouded by division and self-interest. He reshaped the papacy into something more human, more approachable, and more engaged with the real struggles of people. He challenged the status quo, not through dramatic upheaval, but through a steady,

persistent push for a more inclusive and conscientious Church. 'Well done, good and faithful servant!

Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest



The committee had its hands full with this topic, reading some genuinely excellent work. Unfortunately, only one essay at each grade level could be sent to the final selection process at Supreme.



Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask

that you glorify Blessed Michael McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen



The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild promotes the cause for sainthood of the founder of the Knights of Columbus, who was beatified on Oct. 31, 2020. Members of the Guild, and anyone devoted to Father McGivney, can play an active role in the cause by praying for his intercession in times of need, especially in cases of serious illness, and reporting to the Guild any favors received.

Membership in the Guild is free and open to anyone who is devoted to Father McGivney and wishes to invoke his intercession and assist in his sainthood cause through prayer. Members receive a quarterly newsletter and are remembered in a weekly Mass offered for their intentions.

Catholic men who wish to live out the vision and mission of Father McGivney are invited to join the Knights of Columbus and become part of a network of charity, unity and fraternity that serves local parishes and communities. Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 in New Haven, Conn., and died at the age of 38 in 1890. His cause for sainthood was opened in 1997, and his heroic virtue was recognized by the Vatican in March 2008, when he was declared a Venerable Servant of God by Pope Benedict XVI.

On May 26, 2020, Father McGivney took another step toward sainthood when Pope Francis approved the promulgation of a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to his intercession. With the approval of this miracle, he was beatified on Oct. 31, 2020, with the title of Blessed.

Another miracle through his intercession is needed for him to be canonized as a saint.

Those devoted to Father McGivney are encouraged to recite regularly the prayer for his canonization, which is available online and on a special prayer card. You may Report favors through this website or by email or regular mail at the addresses listed below.
