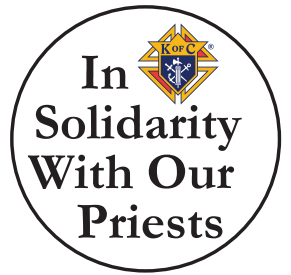

NYS Eucharistic Congress

October 20-22

There is a Eucharistic Congress taking place at the Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine in Auriesville, NY on October 20-22. This is NOT a KofC event, but it's our chance to shine and rise to the occasion. The Supreme Knight will be speaking there. There are other organizations involved as well.

The NYS KofC is heavily involved with this event. District Master Bill Venturini, Conference Chairman Darren Gamma and myself are on the Eucharistic Congress committee.

Attached are the flyers for this event. Also attached is the schedule for the 40 hour event and is subject to change.

This is what we know as of today:

- You must be registered to enter the grounds. You will be turned away if not registered.
- No one will be permitted on the grounds without appropriate credentials and they must be displayed at all times.
- Lanyards will be distributed upon arrival.
- If going by bus, the bus captain must submit the list of registered members.
- Buses will need to be registered ASAP
- The bus will drop you off at the Shrine and then park in a separate lot.
- There will be shuttles going back and forth all day and night to the parking lot to get to your cars. There will also be handicapped parking.
- If you plan to stay for more than one day, there are hotels/motels in the area and you have to make your own arrangements.

- When you register, select organization at the bottom, then select either KofC Color Corps, or for non color corps members select KofC.
- Register for Volunteer work if you can, they're looking for parking lot control, assist with handicap movements, information booth help, ushers, etc. relief teams of volunteers working in two or three different shifts is OK.
- Your credentials will be emailed to you after you are registered.
- They are looking for a huge Color Corps turnout. Swords will not be used.
- 4th Degree members that are not part of the Color Copps, can wear a dark suit with their Social Baldric.
- Non-4th Degree Members can wear a council jacket or a dark suit with the yellow and white Ceremonial baldric.
- Volunteers will be contacted before arrival to let them know where they are needed.
- 12 wheelchairs will be delivered the week prior to the event, we will leave 2 for them to keep.
- Approximately 7,000 to 10,000 people will be at the event.
- No Alcohol allowed on the grounds.
- Food trucks and food tents are available for purchase.
- Participants can bring their own food.


