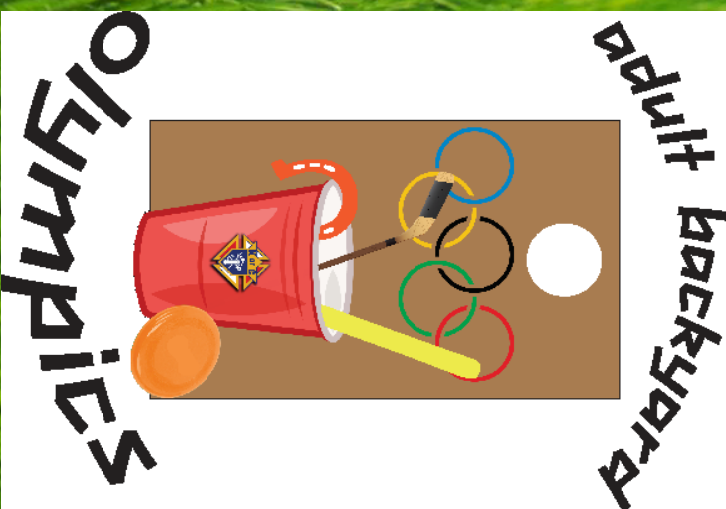
East Fishkill Fire District
